### Meeting Summary Tuesday, June 26, 2018

#### Internal Meeting

1. Comments / Discussion – Receiving Water Trash Monitoring Program (Paul Randall)  
Committee members received an update on progress with sampling and training and reviewed the Trash Assessment Data Collection Form.
  - Action: Committee members will provide comments on the Form to Paul Randall by June 29.
2. Update / Discussion – Private Lands Greater than 10,000 sq. ft. (Beth Baldwin)  
Committee members received an update and discussed challenging scenarios and trash control status report.

#### Main Meeting

3. Introductions, Announcements, Changes to Agenda (Michele Mancuso for Kirsten Struve)
  - Announcements
    - Article: Battle against trash in Oakland is never-ending - San Francisco Chronicle, 2018-05-24 (attached)
    - Ocean Litter Prevention Strategy – The Ocean Protection Council just released the Strategy, which BASMAA reviewed and commented on, including recommending BASMAA and sometimes its member agencies be listed as support for an action listed in the Strategy (infographic attached).
      - Action: BASMAA will track the Strategy's implementation and likely join its Google Group.
4. Approval – April 24, 2018 Meeting Summary (Committee)
  - Vote: The Committee approved the April 24, 2018 meeting summary.
5. Presentation – Town of Moraga's Stormwater Ordinance to Address Private Properties Draining to the MS4 (Edric Kwan and AJ Kennedy)  
Committee members received and discussed the presentation.
6. Update / Planning – Preliminary and Final Reports on Trash Receiving Water Monitoring Program Plan and Related Tasks (C.10.b.v) (Geoff Brosseau)  
Committee members received an update on the status of the project, which is expected to be finally approved by the BASMAA Board of Directors on June 28, and the plans and schedule for the consultant selection process.
  - Action: Executive Director Brosseau will ensure ACCWP and SMCWPPP are aware of their right to have a member on the Selection Group.

7. Update / Comments – Receiving Water Trash Monitoring Program (Paul Randall)  
 Committee members received a report on Item #1.
  - Action: Paul Randall will provide EPA with the final version of the Trash Assessment Data Collection Form.
  
8. Update – Private Lands Greater than 10,000 sq. ft. (Beth Baldwin)  
 Committee members received a report on Item #2.
  - Action: Cheri Donnelly will share the City of Cupertino’s ordinance and conditions of approval.
  
9. Update – Regional Water Board (Dale Bowyer)  
 Committee members received an update from Regional Water Board staff on current and planned trash-management related activities, including the following:
  - Enforcement orders: 6 MRP permittees and Caltrans – Reviewed the actions taken by the Regional Water Board in its June 13 meeting.
  - Field inspections – Relayed their observation of “tophat” units without overhead covers that are located in inlets in such a way that trash can fall directly into the middle of the unit, bypassing the filter.
    - Action: Regional Water Board staff will provide a description and photos of the installations.
  
10. Update – Statewide Trash Amendments (Geoff Brosseau / Chris Sommers)  
 Committee members received an update on the status and next steps on activities associated with addressing the statewide Trash Amendments.
  - BMPs – State Water Board staff has been getting additional input on the information sheets raising concerns about factoring in hydromodification requirements and private facilities. Although staff continues to express an interest in providing guidance to MS4s, these complicating factors appear to be pushing staff to provide less detailed guidance and instead refer to the stormwater permits. CASQA staff agreed to provide revised content for State Water Board staff’s consideration.
    - Action: Executive Director Brosseau will provide Regional Water Board staff with the CASQA full capture system equivalency modeling analyses.
  - Mosquito concerns – The Mosquito and Vector Control Association of California (MVCAC) has raised concerns with the State Water Board and CASQA regarding the increasing number of trash Full Capture Systems being installed throughout the state, particularly those designs that tend to contain standing water and provide insufficient access for pesticidal treatments. The State Water Board invited manufacturers to the MVCAC’s next quarterly meeting (April 27; South Lake Tahoe). Chris Sommers and Dale Bowyer attended in person, Executive Director Brosseau attended by phone. The different types of parties (districts, Water Boards, manufacturers, MS4s) shared their interests and concerns. The districts agreed to provide information on the new, highly problematic species of mosquito that is

prompting their renewed concerns. Manufacturers agreed to review their designs to try to minimize the creation of breeding habitat and provide sufficient access for inspection and abatement. The most recent development is State Water Board staff was to meet with California Department of Public Health staff on June 6 to discuss a protocol for evaluating FCS devices.
