BACKGROUND

In most parts of the San Francisco Bay Area, storm drains are pathways for pollution from streets, gutters, and other paved surfaces to local creeks, the Bay, Ocean, or Delta.

Wash water from surface cleaning often carries pollutants that can harm wildlife that depend upon healthy waterways for survival.

Allowing polluting substances into storm drains is prohibited by law in California. Both the person who discharges the pollutant or leaves it behind, and the owner of the property where it is generated are *liable*.

The Bay Area Stormwater Management Agencies Association (BASMAA) and the Regional Water Quality Control Board are sponsoring this workshop to show you methods for simple, safe, and legal cleaning and disposal. Water quality experts will show you how you can do your job, protect the environment, and meet the requirements of the law.

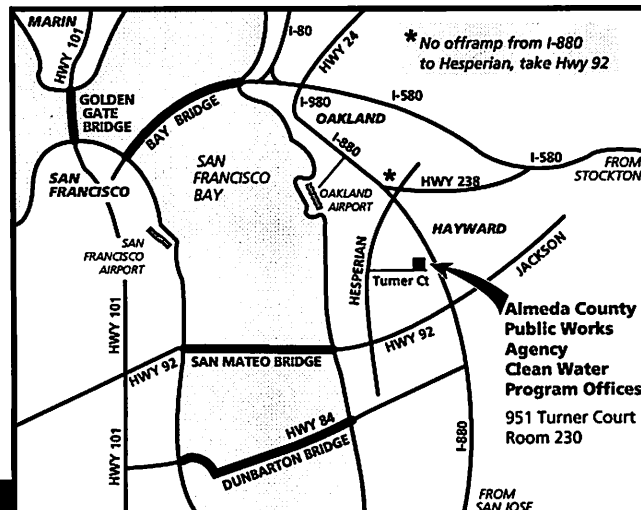
OFFICIAL RECOGNITION
