BACKGROUND

In most parts of the San Francisco Bay Area, storm drains are pathways for pollution from streets, gutters, and paved surfaces to local creeks, the Bay, Ocean, or Delta.

Wash water from surface cleaning often carries pollutants that can harm wildlife that depend upon healthy waterways for survival.

Allowing polluting substances into storm drains is prohibited by law in California. Both the person who discharges the pollutant or leaves it behind, and the owner of the property where it is generated are *liable*.

The Bay Area Stormwater Management Agencies Association (BASMAA) and the San Francisco Bay Regional Water Quality Control Board (RWQCB) are sponsoring these workshops to show you methods for simple, safe, and legal cleaning and disposal. Water quality experts will show you how you can do your job, protect the environment, and meet the requirements of the law.

OFFICIAL RECOGNITION

Participants who take a short, simple test on methods to prevent pollution from surface cleaning will receive official recognition by BASMAA. The test will be administered at the end of the workshops.

Official recognition can benefit your business because BASMAA will inform potential customers that your company is aware of and will use important pollution control measures when doing surface cleaning work.

#1 WORKSHOP

- **Southbound on 680**

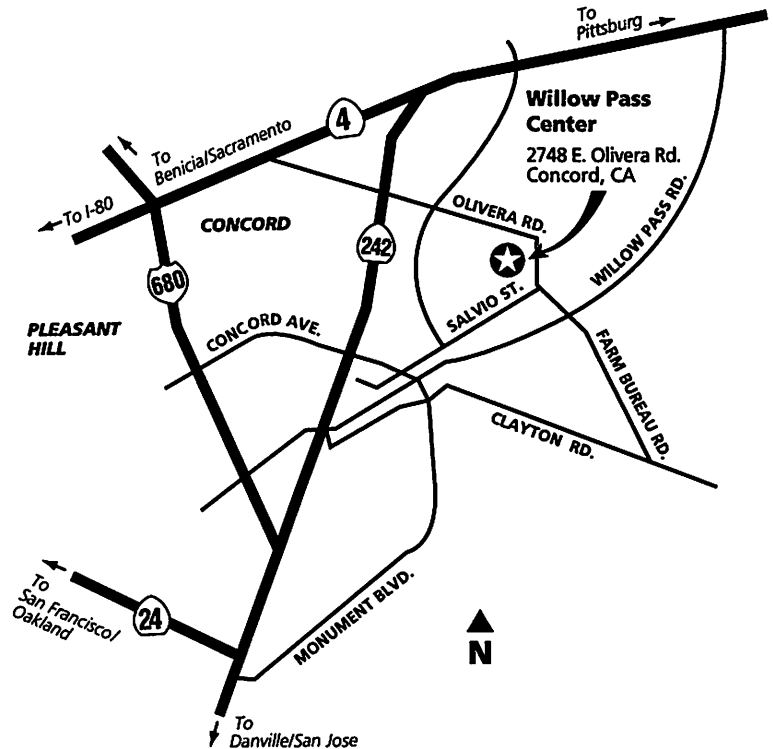
Drive east on Hwy 4 to Willow Pass exit. Turn right on Willow Pass go straight to E. Olivera and turn right on the left just past Salvio St.

- **Northbound on 680**

Take 680 to Concord 242, to the E. Olivera exit. Turn right on E. Olivera, go straight. Willow Pass Center will be on the right.

- **From Pittsburg**

Drive west on Hwy 4 to Willow Pass exit. Turn left onto Willow Pass go straight to E. Olivera and turn right. The Willow Pass Center driveway is on the left just past Salvio St.



#2 WORKSHOP

Directions to:

- **From Highway 101**

Take the San Antonio Road Exit (west) and then go north on Middlefield Road. Turn into parking lot opposite Montrose.

- **Southbound on 280**

Exit at Page Mill Road East (Page Mill becomes Oregon Expressway). Cross El Camino Real and drive through underpass. Turn right onto Middlefield Road. Travel approximately 2 miles past East Meadow and past Charleston. Turn right at first traffic light into parking lot, opposite Montrose.

- **Northbound on 280**

Exit El Monte Road, toward Los Altos. Turn left onto Foothill Expressway. Turn right onto San Antonio Road. Turn left onto Middlefield Road. Turn left at first traffic light into parking lot, opposite Montrose.
