Directions

To Center Concord, Clayton Fair Shopping Center, Concord:

From the Bay Bridge: Take 580 East to 24 East (towards Walnut Creek/Berkeley). Take 680 north (turn off on left) to exit on Ygnacio Valley Road East. Follow Ygnacio 7.7 miles to Clayton Road. Left on Clayton to the Clayton Fair Shopping Center (on the left). Center Concord is behind the Athletic Center.

From Sacramento: Cross the Benecia Bridge; take 680 South to exit on Treat Blvd. Turn left on Treat, continue for 6 miles to Clayton Road. Right on Clayton and right into the Clayton Fair Shopping Center. Center Concord is behind the Athletic Center.

To Belmont Sports Complex, Island Parkway, Belmont:

(Located on the Bay side of 101 off Ralston Ave.) Take Ralston East from 101 to Oracle Parkway (first left). Take the first left at Island Parkway. Turn left into the parking lot.

To Alameda County Public Works Agency, 951 Turner Court, Hayward:

(West of 880 and north of 92) Take 92 west of 880 to Hesperian Blvd. exit. Go north on Hesperian. Turn right on Turner Court to the end. Turn left; the building is on the right.

To Marin Art and Garden Center, 30 Sir Francis Drake Blvd., Ross

(West of 101) *From 101:* Take The Sir Francis Drake Blvd./San Anselmo exit west. Go west on Sir Francis Drake 2.5 miles. Center is across from Lagunitas Blvd. on the right.

From East Bay: Take the Richmond/San Rafael Bridge to the San Quentin/Sir Francis Drake Blvd. exit, immediately after the bridge. Follow Sir Francis Drake Blvd. (crossing under 101) for 4.5 miles to Center, across from Lagunitas Blvd. on the right.

To San José/Santa Clara Water Pollution Control Plant, 700 Los Esteros Rd., San José

(On the Bay side of 237 west of Milpitas) Take 680, 880, or 101 to 237. Drive towards the Bay to the Zanker Rd. exit. Go north on Zanker; it curves and becomes Los Esteros. The WPCP administration building and parking lot are on your left.

To JFK County Library, 505 Santa Clara, Vallejo

Take I-80 to the CA-29/Sonoma Blvd. exit. Go north on Sonoma Blvd. 2.1 miles to Georgia. Turn left onto Georgia and right onto Santa Clara.
