#### Main Meeting

1. Introductions, announcements, and agenda review.....1:30
  - SANDY: CASQA Legislative – SB 205 Amendment (891).
  - HOWARD: Flowchart or handout for contractors on trenching & dewatering.
2. Updates.....1:35
  - a. Phase II Permit
    - i. Additional delays: The State Water Board is still trying to finalize the Caltrans and Construction General Permits, so their latest estimate is that we may not see a draft of the Phase II Permit until early next calendar year. See Rob's 3/17/22 email.
    - ii. PCBs: we will need to talk to the Water Board regarding PCB program development.
    - iii. **ACTION: Review post-construction treatment numbers from this permit term. If your municipality did not provide, please bring to meeting as much as possible.**
    - iv. **ACTION: Put PBCs discussion on the next meeting for full strategy discussion**
  - b. E.12 Stormwater Post-Construction Staff Training
    - i. April 12, 2022, 1:00-3:30PM
    - ii. All from Marin, Napa, Sonoma, and Solano County are welcome to attend

- iv. Separate Issue: We discussed doing a similar training for private developers, but did not figure out dates. **ACTION: Rob and Sandy will send out potential dates and determine the best times for the group.**
    - 1. This was slated to be in-person. However, there is also merit to having it via Zoom. The group informally was in favor of virtual.  
**ACTION: Rob and Sandy will work on these logistics along with the potential dates (maybe put a poll together).**
  - v. **ACTION: Sandy to reach out to Dan to get draft agenda for upcoming presentation**
  - vi. Note: Solano and Sonoma County population numbers are not updated. This is a bit complicated because both counties are split by Water Board. The smaller size of these counties populations means that the cost share doesn't appear to change that much. **ACTION: review and let the group know if population numbers need adjusting for your agency.**
4. CASQA Legislative – SB 205 Amendment (891).
- a. This says that prior to issuance of a business license, the municipality would have to get the Standard Industrial Classification (SIC) Code and ensure that any business that would need Industrial General Permit (IGP) coverage obtains it.
  - b. State Water Board would have to provide justification for the No Exposure Certification (NEC) & Notice of Non-Applicability (NONA).
  - c. Would require the Water Board spend 50% of revenue on inspections.

  - e. **ACTION: Review and provide and red flags to Sandy and Rob ASAP.**
5. Dewatering: request for flowchart or handout for contractors on trenching & dewatering, for those projects that do not require CGP.
- a. There's a mix of approaches. Include some minimum control measures or monitoring, visual monitoring prior to discharge, to going to the Water Board or EMBUD for a discharge permit.
