## Trash Committee

### **DRAFT** Meeting Summary Tuesday, August 24, 2021

#### Main Meeting

1. Introductions, Announcements, and Changes to Agenda

2. Overview of Direct Discharge Control Programs

The cities of San Jose, Fremont, and Oakland as well Contra Costa County presented on their Direct Discharge Control Plans (DDCP). While many of the plans had similar elements, each presenter also highlighted the unique aspects of their plans relative to their municipalities' organizational structures and unsheltered populations. All presenters noted that they have seen an increase in the number of unsheltered and that COVID exasperated the issue.

Subcommittee members asked numerous questions about the presenters' respective DDCPs. These questions included criteria used to prioritize encampments cleanups, notification processes used to inform the unsheltered of upcoming cleanups, and measures to prevent re-encampment. Presenters were also asked how they evaluate the effectiveness of their plans.

3. Update – Report from Regional Water Board (Derek Beauduy)

Derek Beauduy reported that the draft Tentative Order (T.O.) for the reissuance of the Municipal Regional Stormwater Permit (MRP 3.0) is currently undergoing review by Department of Finance. It is scheduled for release in early September and Water Board will be holding a public hearing on the draft on October 12 and 13. Water Board staff will be coordinating with Permittees on topics to be covered each day and meeting logistics.

Derek also reported that Water Board staff are reviewing Permittees' Section C.10 responses in the FY 2020 Annual Reports and inspecting full trash capture devices in the field.

4. Update – Report from Caltrans (Ken Johansson)

Ken Johansson presented on the new Clean California Initiative. The program includes funds for litter abatement, beautification, public education, and includes a local grant program. The local grant program will provide approximately \$300 million to local governments statewide for projects that address the key components of the Clean California Initiative.

Subcommittee members asked numerous about Clean California including the public education component and what that will entail and how effectiveness will be measured. While much of details are still under development, examples such as tarp giveaways and messaging for covering loads were given.

Ken also shared that a meeting will be held this Friday on Cooperative Implementation Agreements (CIA) that Caltrans has with local governments. Subcommittee members who were interested in attending this meeting but do not have a CIA are welcome to attend to learn more about the projects and funding structure.

5. Update – Statewide Items (Beth Baldwin)

Due to time constraints, Beth did not give the statewide update. Instead, she will email the update to Subcommittee members later in the week.

6. Summary - Action Items, Next Steps, and Next Meeting Date
